The Riverside-Inwood Neighborhood Garden (RING) celebrates 16 years at the Tighe Triangle this year. We are an award-winning, community volunteer-operated, botanical garden, built on top of an asphalted Parks Department triangle. RING's extensive renovation, courtesy of Ruth Messinger's capital outlays as Borough President, allow RING to continue on as a permanent garden, and we plan to make the most of it.

It is important to remember that the government funding <u>Does Not</u> extend to ongoing upkeep or new special projects. From now on, RING is expected to finance, or otherwise procure, all plants, tools, and other equipment. If we wish to have new programs, like performances in the patio, we must finance those ourselves. As always, we are also required (by our license agreement with the City) to undertake all tasks to see to it that the garden is planted and maintained. RING is also required by the Parks department to post at least 10 hours that the garden will actually be open every week from April 1 to Oct. 31. This requires people who will open the garden. Maybe you know an organization that would like to hold meetings there? As long as the gates are open so the public can pass through, its ok. If you join RING, you can get a key on request, and receive our newsletter.
